Sacrament of Baptism for Infants: Baptisms are scheduled after meeting with a priest. Parents or guardians and sponsors are required to attend a baptism class prior to the baptism. Baptisms are at 11:00 a.m. in English on the 3rd Saturday of the month.

Sacrament of Matrimony: Weddings are scheduled by meeting with a priest at least six months prior to the wedding.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick: Call the Parish Office. A minister is also available for pastoral visits and to bring Holy Communion to our parish sick and home-bound.

In Alaska, the lengthening and warming of days are in keeping with the spirit of Easter. Jesus rises from the dead and walks into the light of new life. For us, the snow is almost all gone, we have 1 hour and 11 minutes more daylight today than we did on Easter Sunday. On this Third Sunday of Easter, we continue our walk toward the light of God's truth and love.

The empty tomb of Easter Sunday is not the end of the story of Jesus' life. It is a new beginning. The apostles and disciples must now seek Him out, leave the old memories of Jerusalem and the Crucifixion behind, believe in what they see in His appearances, and pursue the life that He awakened in them. This pursuit will lead them toward His Ascension to heaven and Pentecost. They are being led to a life sanctified by the Holy Spirit while they are in the midst of trials and struggles of life. Yet now, they have the blessings and presence of God.

A new beginning! Sometimes we need opportunities to move from death to life. We need the opportunity to start over. This is not to ignore the past or not to be self-aware. It is not possible to run away from ourselves. Wherever we are, there we are.

Starting over means that there is the hope for life that is presented before us. Sometimes we need only to take a risk and accept the opportunities that are presented to us in the moment. Other times, it means viewing that which is already familiar with a new attitude. Often our attitude going into a situation influences how we read a situation and respond to it.

As you know, the Rectory Project begins this week. It is a new beginning for Holy Family Cathedral. We thank the Lord for the time and service that the old rectory building has given to the faithful. With gratitude, we remember the members of the community who built it back in 1955. In the past few months, parishioners have warmly shared stories with me about the rectory. I am reminded of how God provides for the faithful.

The new project will provide the community with new opportunities and new stories of God in our lives. I thank you for your prayers and patience as this 9-month project gets under way. The start will appear to be slow as interior asbestos abatement begins. May 4th is the big day when demolition of the building begins in earnest. As a footnote, last week the Friars moved to our apartments about a mile from the Cathedral. Although, grateful that we can be relatively close by, there is still the feeling of a temporary "exile" so to speak. We are not used to living so far from our home and community. New beginnings indeed. St. Dominic pray for us!
