THE PASTOR'S CORNER

“I am the living bread that came down from heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will live forever.” John 6:51

The Bread of Life Discourse from the Gospel of John takes place in the synagogue in Capernaum. Contained in the 6th chapter of John are three related events: The Feeding of the 5,000 with the multiplication of the loaves; Jesus Walking on Water during the night; The Bread of Life Discourse.

It would seem that placing the event of Jesus Walking on Water between the Feeding of the 5,000 and the Bread of Life Discourse weakens the powerful connection between Jesus multiplying loaves of bread and his claiming to be the Bread of Life. First he provides bread that sustains life here on earth. Then he reveals he is the bread that gives eternal life in heaven.

So why does John split these two elements with a story of Jesus walking on water? The answer requires us to reflect upon Original Sin. In the garden of Eden, immediately after they are created in the image and likeness of God, Adam and Eve are given Dominion over all the earth. God gives them authority over all creation. Creation belongs to God, but he delegates his authority to Adam and Eve. This authority is lost with Original Sin. Not only are Adam and Eve thrown into disorder by their sin, everything below them in “the chain of command” is thrown into disorder. With Original Sin, Adam and Eve are separated from God and their authority over creation is lost.

By placing the event of Jesus walking on the water between the miracles of the earthly bread and heavenly bread, we are being told that at the center of these miracles is the restoration of man. Jesus is the perfect union of man and God. By walking on water, Jesus is exerting his authority both as God and man over all creation. God the Father would not be asking God the Son to become incarnate and perform these miracles unless it was the Father's intention to absolve man of his sins and restore man to his intended place in creation. The glory of man's place in creation does not come from his authority over it, it comes from man's intimacy with his creator.

Thus, to have Jesus walking on the water between the two “bread events” reveals the vision of the Father for humanity. The Multiplication of the Loaves is not to end with the simple satisfaction of a bodily appetite, it is to provide hope that the complete satisfaction of man is going to be provided by Jesus. Here on earth in the Eucharist, Jesus is both a means and a destiny that promise an even greater fulfillment of the soul in heaven. This fulfillment is the satisfaction of the soul's hunger to know and love God, for which the soul was created to do.
