Sacrament of Baptism for Infants: Baptisms are scheduled after meeting with a priest. Parents or guardians and sponsors are required to attend a baptism class prior to the baptism. Baptisms are at 11:00 a.m. in English on the 3rd Saturday of the month.

Sacrament of Matrimony: Weddings are scheduled by meeting with a priest at least six months prior to the wedding.

“Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD, whose hope is the LORD. He is like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream: it fears not the heat when it comes; its leaves stay green; in the year of drought it shows no distress, but still bears fruit.”
Jerimiah 17:7-8

Does God give you confidence? An interesting question. Sometimes a person’s confidence comes from their knowledge, ability and experience. Other times, confidence can be a result of what a person has. Material goods and financial resources can help a person feel secure and accepted. Relationships are also a source of confidence. The esteem of colleagues and the love of family and friends are important sources of a person’s self-assurance.

These sources of confidence: ability, material resources and relationships can radically change over a lifetime. They fluctuate in levels of abundance in a person’s life and can be a source of confidence for good and healthy reasons. They also can create a false self-assurance and foment the sins of pride, vanity and envy.

Our reading from Jeremiah uses the image of a tree planted near a stream to illustrate how God is the source of our well-being and self-assurance. Regardless of the season, the tree is always green because it draws water from the stream. Jeremiah reminds us to place our trust in God. The seasons in our lives change. But the truth and love of God does not. He often chooses to express his love for us through the people in our lives. Yet in the end, God is the source of truth and love.

This does not mean rejecting the daily concerns of life. It is usually through the legitimate needs of life that God draws us to Himself and teaches us how to discern the true call to confidence from the false ones.

This is the kind of faith that we speak of when we talk about the holy men and women of the Church. The saints were deeply rooted in God’s truth and love. They knew their greatest sense of self-worth, peace, joy and happiness came from being in love with God, knowing God loved them and choosing to love like God.

Next Saturday, February 23 at 12:00pm, Holy Family Cathedral will celebrate a Dedication Mass for the new rectory. Archbishop Etienne will be presiding. Archbishop Schwietz will be attending. Visiting from the Western Dominican Province will be Fr. Christopher Fadok, OP (Provincial), Fr. Michael Fones, OP (Socius/Vicar-Provincial), Fr. James Moore, OP (Development Director) and Fr. LaSalle Hallisey, OP (former HFC pastor). Please come and celebrate this historic occasion. A reception will follow the Mass in the parish hall.

Also next week is the annual Convocation of Priests in Alaska. The priests serving in the Archdiocese of Anchorage and the Dioceses of Fairbanks and Juneau will meet at Our Lady of Guadalupe from Monday – Thursday this week. Because of the Convocation, there will be no 11:30am Confessions or 12:10pm Mass at the Cathedral during these days.
