Today we celebrate Rosary Sunday. The Rosary is a prayer of petition and a prayer seeking understanding. Over the centuries the Rosary has been proven time and again as an effective prayer for all Catholics for every need. By tradition, we believe that St. Dominic received the Rosary from the Blessed Mother.

From the very beginning of the Order, the Dominicans have fervently promoted the Rosary as both a prayer of petition and as a prayer seeking understanding. The mysteries of the Rosary direct the faithful not only to place their faith in the love of God given to them in Jesus, but also to seek to know and understand the person of Christ as our savior and Lord.

We do this with the help of Mary's intercession. Mary is the most perfect intercessor because of her knowledge of Jesus and because of her own trust that she placed in God when the Angel Gabriel announced her pregnancy. Through the profound experience of being the Jesus' mother, Mary leads us by example to a greater faith in Jesus and deeper understanding of him.

This Sunday, we make our annual Dominican appeal. Once a year, the Dominicans are allowed to take up a collection that goes to support the Dominican Friars. The Friars designate it for our brothers who are being prepared for the priesthood. Three times in the past five summers we had the wonderful experience of our first year Novice brothers visiting us in Anchorage. This past September five men joined the novitiate for our province and received the habit of St. Dominic.

Holy Family Old Cathedral also has had many Dominican student brothers assigned here for their pastoral residency year. Every year brothers go out on a pastoral residency year. Not every Dominican ministry in the West, fifteen in all, will host a student brother. Since 2007, we've had five residency student brothers who are now priests: Fr. Mark Francis Manzano Fr. Dominic David Maichrowicz, Fr. Peter Hannah, Fr. Justin Gable and Fr. Thomas Aquinas Pickett. Also, former residency students at Holy Family, Br. Josh Gatus (2017-18) was ordained a deacon this past spring. Br. Columban Hall (2018-19) made his final profession of vows last May. Br. Andrew Kang (2019-2020) will make his final profession of vows next spring.

This year we are blessed to have Br. Benedict Mary Bartsch, OP, with us. Today, he will share with us his vocation story at the Masses. The Development Director for the Western Dominican Province, Fr. James Moore, OP, is preaching our Masses today. I ask that you consider once again making a donation to support our seminarians. The Friars and I thank you for these many years of your generous financial support and prayers. You have helped forward the mission of the Dominicans of preaching the gospel for the salvation of souls.
