I returned last Saturday from a week of vacation. It was a road trip and a lot of fun. Fr. Bart and I traveled almost 2000 miles in Alaska. Over 400 miles were on dirt and gravel roads. We went up the Dalton Highway over the Atigun Pass in the Brooks Range. The views were tremendous. The sun never set. We visited McCarthy and the Kennecott Mine in the Wrangel Mountains and took the ferry from Valdez to Whittier on the way home.

Along the way, someone we met, after learning we were Catholic priests, asked us: "What do you think God is trying to tell us through all of this?" They gestured to our surroundings. A great question. The answer came more easily than I would have thought. Power. Majesty and splendor quickly came to mind, but power described what I was seeing. The vastness of the mountains, rivers, lakes, forests, tundra, and wildlife testified to the creative and life sustaining power of God. The weather seemed to change every 30 minutes. Sun, clouds, rain, mist could be seen all at the same time. Looking at a map indicated all that was in our line of sight was not worthy of mention given how much more there was we could not see.

I was reminded of Psalm 8: "What is man that you are mindful of him, and a son of man that you care for him? Yet you have made him little less than a god, crowned him with glory and honor. You have given him rule over the works of your hands, put all things at his feet." The psalm refers both to the human race and to Jesus who is fully human and divine and the leader of our race.

Alaska testifies to us the power of God. Jesus Christ testifies to us the power of God (who made Alaska) that he shares with us. For in baptism we are incorporated into the life the Trinity - the one God and Three persons who existed before time began and created us and our world. As humans we are so fragile and yet so powerful because God made in his image and likeness and has redeemed us through the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.
