PASTOR'S CORNER

“The apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught. He said to them, ‘Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while.’ People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat.” Mark 6:30-31.

Nowhere in the Gospels are accounts of the apostles preaching, healing and casting out demons. Last Sunday, Jesus commissioned the apostles to do this

work and gave them instructions how they are to travel. Yet, we never hear a story about Peter, John, James, Andrew or any other apostle actually healing the sick or casting out a demon.

In today's Gospel, we get a hint of how they did. They were successful. Word is spreading throughout Galilee about their work. Large crowds are now following them. They can no longer travel unnoticed. They cannot even find time to eat a meal. Opportunities are opening for them. People know who they are. People recognize their power, offering respect and adoration. A good question for us to ask is this: What will be the apostles response to their success? Do they leverage their advantages for further gain? Do they consolidate their position? Do they return to the source of their success?

They actually don't have a choice. Jesus gathers them together and tells them what to do next. They need to do what he does. Go away from the crowds. Get some rest and pray. Why? Because God the Father is running "the show." They need to have the Father first in their minds, and it will be in their prayer that the Father will give them rest, renewal, strength, peace, and wisdom. The temptations of ego, pride and vanity that their success stirs must be abated by closeness to the Divine. The soul must be fed or else their weariness and hunger will turn them to other things.

No doubt the apostles understand that their power comes from the authority of Jesus. He has commissioned them to do what he himself is doing. It is wise that they follow his example of going off to a deserted place to rest and pray just like he does. The apostles are undergoing spiritual formation under the guidance of Jesus himself.

We often think of "down time" as "my own time." Today be inspired to think that rest and relaxation cannot be successfully done without us paying attention to God. Prayer is work. Prayer takes time. Just as we need quality time with family and friends, we need quality time with God. This does not necessarily mean taking a retreat, although retreats are definitely life giving. It means that we view our vacations as time to share with God in an unhurried manner. We enjoy our time, remembering God even in the midst of a happy moment of activity. We take leisure time to think about God, attend a daily Mass, a holy hour or pray the Rosary.
