The best 4th of July I ever celebrated was when I was on deployment in Afghanistan. I was at a patrol base manned by 150 soldiers near the Pakistan border. MRE's were the main source of food. We didn't have running water. It was hot. On that day, I was talking with a soldier who had received in the mail a box of Lipton tea bags and a box of C&H sugar packets. He was sitting on the ground with two flats of bottled water and was making sweet tea for his platoon. He said to me: "Chaplain, I'm from Florida and where I come from it isn't the 4th of July without sweet tea." What made that 4th of July so good was deprivation. It heightened my awareness of the good things at home and our quality of life. It made me more grateful for the effort made by generations of citizens to build a fair and just nation. Though not yet a perfect nation, we have so much to be thankful for, beyond what words can properly express.

I encourage you this 4th of July to take a moment to thank God for what we have been given as a nation. Ask God to help you joyfully focus on what is most important in your life and on the quality of life that God desires you to have. Pray to God that his will be done for our country and its people.

Our Catholic understanding of freedom is not the availability of many choices but rather access to the highest good that we are meant to have. Ignorance and sin block pathways and impede access to God who is the greatest desire of our souls.

In today's gospel Jesus addresses the 72 disciples who have returned from their successful mission of healing the sick, casting out demons and preaching the kingdom of God. He reminds them not to marvel at the authority he has given them but to rejoice because such power is a sign that they have a place in heaven.

Jesus seeing "Satan falling from the sky like lightning" is an extraordinary image of what is going to happen when he dies on the cross and rises from the dead. The mercy of God poured out in the blood of Christ will win us our freedom and open the road to heaven. Our happiness comes from our freedom to know, love and be with God forever. Only in God can we be free.
