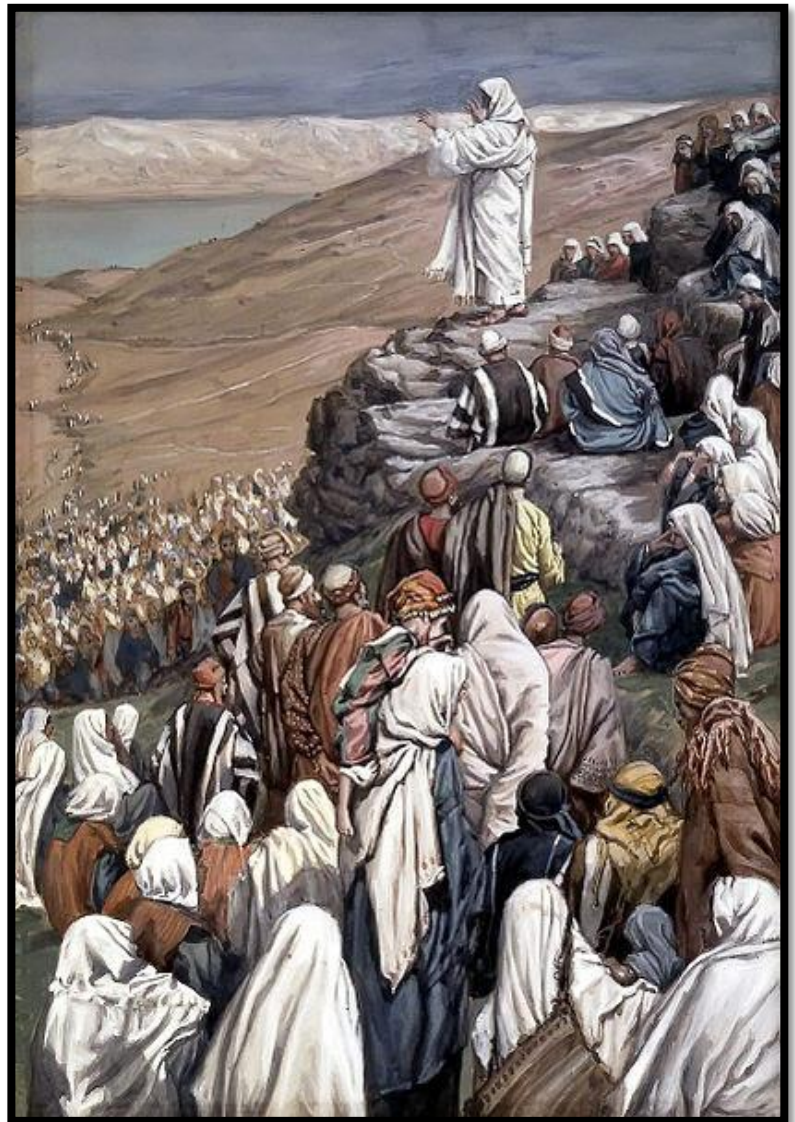

Land productivity is a sign of the covenant between God and the Israelites. God promises them their own land that will support them if they are faithful to the covenant. They will be His People and He will be their God. In the Old Testament, whenever there is a drought, pestilence, war or any event that prevents the land from providing for the Jews, it means that they are not being faithful to the covenant. The land rejects them for their corporate or communal infidelity. In extreme cases, the land is taken away from them. They are invaded by another nation and part of the population go into exile to the land of the occupying nation, ie: Babylon.

Normally, God is very patient with an unfaithful Israel. It always takes time for the land to begin to show signs of rejection to catch up to their transgressions. God also sends prophets to tell the people they are going bad; to warn them of the consequences and to show how they can "come home" when they come to their senses about their sins against God.

In the case of our parable today, the Rich Man has forgotten that his riches are a blessing from God. He rejoices not in God who has provided him his material security but in the wealth itself. Jesus calls him a fool because he places his happiness in his material belongings. Jesus logically points out that when the man's life ends his happiness ends. When he dies he will be separated from the source of happiness.

Our true treasure is in God, who gives us life and is our soul's greatest desire and happiness. The treasure of God, his love and the communion of believers, are the only treasures that go with us from our earthly life to the life of heaven. The Rich Man's greatest source of happiness and concern before dying should be his life of faith and the faith of his loved ones.

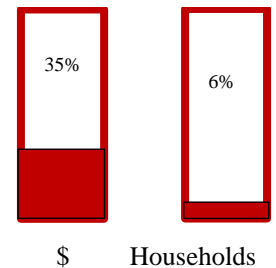
