PASTOR'S CORNER

“You cannot serve both God and Mammon”

Luke 16:13

Every time a Dominican friar moves to a new assignment he is faced with packing his belongings and arranging them for shipment to his next assignment.

Usually this means borrowing or renting an SUV, packing

it with boxes, and driving it the new community. Twice I've done the "minivan shuffle" between San Francisco and Seattle. Once we had an industrious brother who rented a U-Haul truck and coordinated six of the brother's moves in one round trip up and back down the West Coast. The majority of our belongings are books and clothing. But various combinations of administrative files, crucifixes, statues, pictures, bicycles, musical instruments, sports equipment and camping gear are also part of the mix.

It is a good time for a friar to cull through his belongings and prayerfully ask the question: "Do I really need all this?" He asks the question from the standing point of "help or hinderance." Are these things helping me follow God or are they nice but not necessary? Will letting go of these things help me be more mindful of God and open hearted to the Spirit as I begin a new ministry with a new community of the brothers?

Regarding belongings and material wealth, Jesus today is very direct. He says: "You cannot serve both God and Mammon." Mammon is defined as: "earthly goods in which one places their trust." You can trust one or the other but not both. This makes sense. Two different types of trust are required. Mammon is not a person. Jesus is. We often use the word "trust" when we really mean "rely." For example, a mechanic relies on his tools to do his work. This reliance is a type of trust but not the trust Jesus is talking about.

Jesus is talking about our more noble capacity to serve God because we can know and trust the Divine being, similar to how we can know and trust another human. How much good and happiness is achieved in our world because of human trust? How greater will that goodness be when trust is ordered toward God? Trust placed in the three persons of the Holy Trinity results in the greatest human good.

Through the sacraments, especially the Eucharist and the life of Christian charity, there is a lot to be discovered of God's goodness and human happiness here on earth.

To be clear, Jesus does not condemn wealth. He condemns the subjection or rejection of God in favor of wealth or other earthly goals such as honor, glory, esteem, accomplishment and power. The allure of these goals can be more seductive than money alone. Such pursuits, which often require rigorous use of human talents and discipline, are confined to this world. They do not translate into the next life. Despite their excellences, the full potential of the human person is left unfulfilled when God is not at the head of the endeavor. When they are ordered toward the Divine, such pursuits can now also accomplish heavenly work as they witness the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ in a manner fitting to their nature.

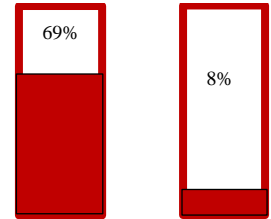
